As technologists the class will be working on their ability to code. They will use 'Skitch' to programme 'sprites' and make them perform certain functions.

Moreover, the children will be working on their ability to use word and all of its functions.

Through their increasing understanding, the importance of e-safety and research safety will be discussed and covered vigilantly.

Geography

As Geographers, the children will work on their knowledge of Ancient Greece, where and why different city states settled in different places.
