English

In English lessons this term, we will be reading the story of 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson. We will be making predictions through role-play and sequencing the main events from the story, as well as using it as a stimulus for learning about nouns and verba and how these are used to create simple sentences. We will learn how to use conjunctions to make our sentences longer, and practise using capital letters for different purposes. Once we have identified the sections of the story and had an opportunity to orally retell it, we will use it to plan and write our own stories about another heroic creature that might live in our local environment. Later in the term, we will be looking at explanation texts in the form of life cycles. We will ask and answer our questions using the information in the texts; sequence the important and explore the key features before writing our own.

Mathematics

As **mathematicians**, we will be counting in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in 10s from any number, forward and backward. We will practise recognising the place value of each digit in a two-digit number, and use this knowledge to compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100, as well as to read and write numbers in numerals and words. We will use concrete objects and pictoral representations to add and subtract a one digit or tens number to/from a two-digit number, then use our new skills to solve problems involving numbers, quantities and measures. We will begin to explore the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction as a route to checking our calculations.

Science

As **scientists**, we will be exploring habitats of living things in our local environment. We will find out how animals are suited to their habitat and consider how they have adapted over time. We will also explore food chains and what would happen if prey became extinct.

Geography

As **geographers**, we will be using maps, plan perspectives ad aerial photographs to explore the school, its grounds and the local environment. We will learn how to construct and use a key, and conduct fieldwork in the local area in order to identify physical and human features. We will finish the term by identifying Kings Cliffe on a UK map, and locating some of the countries and capital cities.

Music

As **musicians** we will be developing our singing skills and learning about pitch and pulse. Mrs Hutchings will also be teaching us how to play the ocarina.

and Technology

As **artists**, we will be developing the ability to use texture in our artwork to produce a collage showing a local habitat. We will be testing new collage techniques to decide which we prefer, and applying these to our final piece.

PE

As **competitors**, we will throw, catch and bounce in different ways when standing still or on the move. As **gymnasts** we will travel and balance on the floor and on apparatus, using different parts of our bodies high or low.

Computing

As **technologists** we will be learning what makes a good photograph then suing the learn pads to take some of our own. We will learn how to edit and enhance our photos then have an opportunity to present them to the class.

E-Safety

As **technologists**, we will revisit the school's e-safety rules and discuss why each one is important. We will have the opportunity to demonstrate our understanding of these rules through role-play, and then put them into practice when using the learn pads, laptops and internet for various activities this term.

> RE As theologians we will be considering special objects that belong to people and the reasons why they are special. We will develop an understanding of the Jewish faith and be able to compare the Christian faith to this.

As **citizens**, we will learn what it means to be part of a community. We will identify the various groups and communities to which we belong, including the class, school and local communities.
