# **Curriculum Overview for Year 4**

## **English**

As <u>writers</u>, the children will be writing an information text about the Mountains of the UK and an adventure story based on our class text The Abominables by Eva Ibbotson.

As mathematicians, the children will develop their understanding of place value up to 1000, mental and formal addition and subtraction, shape and angles.

### **Mathematics**

The children will develop their understanding by using concrete apparatus, formal written methods and a variety of mathematical investigations.

Throughout the year, the children will continue to improve their understanding of the times tables up to 12x12. A times tables test will be conducted on Thursday mornings.

As <u>linguists</u>, the children will be learning how to have a simple conversation in French to get to know someone. The children will develop their vocabulary and understanding through a variety of songs and games.

# Geography

As geographers, the children will be learning about the ctractural features of mountains and rivers and how they are used by society. The children will also be going on a class trip to the Everdon Outdoor Centre where they will be completing a river study.

#### Science

As <u>scientists</u>, the children will be learning about plants. We will explore what different parts of flowering plants do, understand the requirements for a plant to grow and the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

The children will develop their understanding through a range of exciting practical experiments and investigations.

### History

As <u>historians</u>, the children will learn about Sir George Everest and Edmund Hillary.

The children will be using ICT and a variety of sources to

independently complete their own historical research.

### Religious


