Curriculum Overview for Year 3

As <u>writers</u>, the children will be writing a one sided argument as part of book fortnight. The children will also be writing their own play script and will end the half term exploring a variety of poetry. Year 3 will be developing their speaking, listening and drama skills in order to perform their performance poetry at Oundle Festival.

English



As <u>readers</u>, the children will read a variety of texts and genres based on our Topic the Savage Stone Age. The children will take part in class guided reading sessions where they will learn a new comprehension skill and apply this in their group reading with an adult.

Art/DT

As <u>artists</u>, the children will make bowls out of clay and their own clay figurines based on the figurine found in Romania nicknamed 'The Thinker'.

PSHE

As <u>individuals</u>, the children will develop their understanding of how to stay healthy.

We will look at how exercise affects our bodies, develop our understanding of drugs and how to stay safe around the home.

ICT

As <u>technologists</u>, the children will develop their understanding of E-safety and will discover how to use a range of input and output devices efficiently.



As mathematicians, the children will develop their understanding of formal multiplication and division. The children will also develop their understanding of time and money.

Mathematics

The children will develop their understanding by using concrete apparatus, formal written methods and a variety of mathematical investigations.

Throughout the year, the children will continue to improve their understanding of the times tables up to 12x12. A times tables test will be conducted on Thursday mornings.

Modern

Languages

As <u>linguists</u>, the children will be learning how to talk about family and friends. This will include describing their appearance and understanding the difference between masculine and feminine.

Geography

As geographers, the children will be able to name and locate different areas found within Great Britain and Europe where significant prehistoric sites have been found.

Science

As <u>scientists</u>, the children will be learning about forces and magnets later in the term.

The children will develop their understanding through a range of exciting practical experiments and investigations.

As <u>historians,</u> the children will learn about the chronology of the Stone Age, including the three main periods. They will

As <u>competitors</u>, the childten will learn the basic skills and techniques for netball. The shildten will then eventually put these skills into practise by playing High5 netball.


Religious
