Curriculum Overview for Year 5

As readers the children will read the class text (The Devil and his Boy by Anthony Horowitz) and discuss meaning, language and literacy devices through deep and

specific questioning. They will complete comprehension questions with an explicit focus on methods in all lessons. They will draw upon their and techniques for answering longer and particularised questions whilst also completing grammar, vocabulary and punctuation activities weekly. As a result of different types of sentences and how to this, the children will increase their confidence in discussing the book, the author's choices and the impact of the words written with their peers.

As writers Year Five will be learning how to effectively write an epilogue and opening chapter to a story and play scripts as overall results of their separate grammar and sentence foci. All children will be increasing their consistency and fluency in handwriting knowledge of linguistics and sentence structures for effective writing outcomes. Increasing their confidence in clauses, the construct these will be a focus. As actors the children will enhance their understanding of the characters, plot and awareness of texts through drama and imaginative activities.

As scientists Year Five will be immersing themselves in learning about the world around us and reproduction. They will be finding out the process of reproduction in plants and animals, and how this differs for different species. During this learning, they will reinforce their knowledge of plants anatomy, the gestation periods of various animal species and why this process is variable.
