Curriculum Overview for Year 5

English

Mathematics

Year Five will be deepening our awareness of statistics. Learning more subtract up to five digit numbers. To about how to interpret data in a line graph, solve comparison problems on this data, and solve multi step problems too.

Alongside this, they will be interpreting data in timetables to embed their understanding of time in our everyday life and how to solve problems involving this.

As arithmeticians, the children will be refining and embedding their knowledge of how to formally and mentally add and develop their mathematics further, we will also be focussing on rounding to estimate answers, ensuring accuracy. Year Five will be undertaking many openended, discovery activities to embed and deepen their understanding of these mathematical concepts, and how they link to other elements of maths, whilst learning the importance of perseverance and determination.

Art & Design

As Artists, the children will be learning how to use watercolour effectively to create a Tudor Rose painting. Following on from this, Year Five will be researching, designing and creating their very own Tudor pot. This will involve using a variety of different clay techniques, including slabs, slips and coils. When their creations are finished, the children will evaluate their project and reflect upon the process that they have gone through.

Computing

As technologists, the class will be increasing their wider understanding of how to use a variety of equipment in their everyday lives and learning atmosphere with ease.

This half term will have a specific focus on using a variety of programmes, suitable for the task at hand. The children will be refining their skills of general computer use and gain confidence when typing.

History

In history this term, Year Five will be

learning about the Tudor Kings and Queens, and the House of Tudor. The children will put the Tudor era into context of our historical timeline, and plot key events on a timeline of the Tudor era, plotting specific dates where applicable. As well as this, they will be learning about the different lifestyles in the rural and urban areas during this time.

Languages

Music

This term, Year Five will be having a Tudor music workshop day. During this, they will learn how to recite a piece of music as an ensemble, focussing on timbre, dynamics, different instruments and formal musical notation. Year Five has been specially asked to perform in the Katherine of Aragon commemoration festival at Peterborough Cathedral; we will be rehearsing and practising a hymn for this very special event.

Modern

As linguists the children will be taught by Madame Warnes every Friday afternoon to increase their understanding of French through songs, stories and written activities.

As scientists, Year Five will be immersing themselves in learning about different materials. They will use their knowledge of the properties of materials to understand the suitability and purpose of the materials that we use around us.

As the main focus this term, Year Five will be increasing their ability to plan, carry out, and present scientific experiments independently. This will link with their mathematics learning of presenting data and analysing this.

RE

This term, Year Five will be looking at art and music in religion, linking this to our work in music and the tudor era.

Education Physical

During this half term, the children will be taking part in yoga These sessions will expand and deepen their understanding of poses, flows and mindful thinking. Alongside this, the children will learn about the effects of saturated fats on our hearts, the importance of the joints in our bodies and how our muscles work in pairs to aid movement. With Mr Tranmer on a Thursday morning, they will be

focussing on learning the skill of basketball.

PSHE

This term, the children will be identifying, discussing and expanding on their hopes and dreams. Within this unit, children will think about achievable, and rewarding, goals that they can set themselves in the near and distant future. Year Five will be encouraged to become more mindful in their everyday life, school work and demeanour.

They will be asked to demonstrate their learning from literacy, numeracy or topic sessions that week, and they may choose their own way of doing so. Please see the front of their Learning Journal for further details and ideas.

Reading is an integral part to all learning. Please encourage your child to read independently, and when possible hear them read aloud. It is important that your child understands and can talk about what they are reading as well as decoding the words. Please use the suggested questions at the front of the reading record to help you with this.

Whilst your child may already be confident with their times tables, we are aiming for fluency and speed at recall, which is why we have bought into the Tackling Tables Scheme. Please use this at home with your child to increase positivity and confidence towards maths as this would be appreciated hugely.


