We will also be looking at a variety of different types of fiction and non-fiction texts maintaining a positive attitude towards reading and understanding. We will be increasing our familiarity with topical and persuasive arguments in order to write our own.

English

As writers this term we are going to be looking at a variety of writing genres including: poetry and narratives that describe characters, settings and atmosphere and integrates dialogue that allows the action to move forward.

As writers we can accurately use active and passive verbs within our writing.

As writers we can show that we can use the wide variety of punctuation used in KS2.

In RE this term the children will be studying Hinduism and what we can learn

Science

The children will build on their knowledge of living things from previous years and deepen their understanding of why and how organisms are classified. They will explore the process of classification in some detail and how it differs from, but relates to, the identification of living things. Children will become aware of the types and characteristics of organisms that belong in each of the five kingdoms of living things (animals, plants, fungi, bacteria and Protista) and the major sub-groups the kingdoms include.

In PE this term the children will be concentrating on Yoga as well as invasion games specialising in netball and basketball.
