

Curriculum Overview for Year 6

English

As readers, the children will read the class text (Running Wild by Michael Morpurgo) focussing on specific comprehension skills each week. As a class, we will develop our speed of reading and intonation when reading aloud to our peers.

As speakers and listeners Year Six will be increasing their confidence of speaking in front of their peers throughout the curriculum, especially in Literacy, when they perform their own creations.

As writers, Year Six will be learning how to effectively write an animal fact-file, a persuasive letter and an opening to a narrative. Within these writing genres, the children will be learning to write with varied cohesion, the full range of punctuation and developing an understanding of clause structure, punctuation and grammar to increase effect and purpose for the reader.

As actors the children will enhance their understanding of the characters, plot and awareness of texts through drama and imaginative activities.

All children will be increasing their consistency and fluency in handwriting in all lessons. They will draw upon their knowledge of linguistics and sentence structures for effective writing outcomes. Increasing their confidence in clauses, the different types of sentences and how to construct these will be a focus.

Art & Design

As artists, the children will be completing an artist study of Henri Rousseau and his famous rainforest painting of Surprised (1891). To develop the children's skills of watercolour, we will be sketching and painting rainforest leaves. The children will then use these skills to sketch rainforest animals, following their research of artists and styles to enhance their understanding of their own artistic style.

Computing

As technologists the class will be increasing their wider understanding of how to use a variety of equipment in their everyday lives and learning atmosphere with ease.

Design & Technology

Year Six will be creating their very own rainforest biome that will live within our classroom.

Geography

As geographers, children will be exploring where rainforests are located around the world, their climate and weather patterns, and comparing these to areas within Britain. Alongside this, they will learning about the layers of the rainforest, the animals that live within each layer and the native people who live there.

Mathematics

As mathematicians the children will be developing their number sense and knowledge of all number through various open ended number investigations and inquiries. Year Six will be developing their fluency and problem solving abilities in all areas of the mathematics curriculum to deepen and embed previous learning alongside increasing their knowledge of time, converting between units of time and understanding the various units.

Year Six will be learning about ratio and proportion, properties of a circle, statistics of line graphs and pie charts, finding the mean and angles. The children will embed their understanding of finding connections between numbers, patterns and creating connections to other areas of mathematics knowledge.

As arithmeticians the children will learn how to divide using the method of long division. Year Six will learn to use these new and distinguished skills in various real-life contexts and problems solving activities. There will be a specific focus on applying this knowledge when working with money.

Modern

Languages

As linguists the children will continue to develop their understanding of French, how to have a conversation and speak fluently with correct intonation.

Music

As musicians, Year Six will be listening to a range of high quality music from a variety of periods of music and genres, developing their awareness of quality music, discussing the elements of music found within their pieces and their purpose and effect.

Science

As scientists Year Six will be immersing themselves in learning about animal classification. Beginning with taxonomy, the children will develop their awareness of animal classification, how different species are linked together and where we are within the animal kingdom.



Physical

Education

During this half term, the children will be developing their netball skills: we will specifically teach and practise the skills of passing and shooting. Using these skills within games to develop our team skills and communication will lead towards a netball tournament at the end of the half term. We will also begin preparing for the Maypole festival.

PSHE

Year Six will be focussing on their Dreams and Goals, identifying their own personal learning goals, the steps that they need to take in order to get there and how they can impact the world with their dreams and ambitions.

Homework

Year Six will be given weekly spellings that will be tested that Friday. Although we will focus on these in school, practice at home would be much appreciated.

The children will also be set certain pages of their SATs workbooks to be completed before the following Friday. The Revision Guides are there to help with this knowledge if and when necessary.

Mymaths is still open for Year 6 pupils. Although certain tasks will not be set weekly, this can be used as much as desired.

Reading is essential. Please read with your child for 10 – 20 minutes per day, encouraging them to read with fluency and speed to aid their understanding. You can read anything that interests you, and does not have to be a novel. All reading is GREAT reading!

Whilst your child may already be confident with their times tables, we are aiming for fluency and speed at recall. The more practise the better!

Homework will be given on Fridays for completion by the following Friday where we will mark it as a class.
