### A Note from the School Council

Autumn Term Update - December 2019

The School Council have been very busy since the start of the school year in September so we wanted to take the opportunity to update you with some of the activities we have been involved in.

At the start of the year, the School Council decided which charities the school would support this year. After discussion and a vote, it was decided we would support the Asthma UK and WWF charities. On 15th November, we organised a charity pyjama day for Children in Need and raised a total of £192.60. During week commencing  $18^{th}$  November, the School Council ran a Healthy Snack Shop selling a variety of healthier snacks. The shop was run during playtimes on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and raised a total of £86.66 for our chosen charities. This week, we all enjoyed wearing our Christmas jumpers and raised a further £188.00 for our charities.

#### **Dear Parents**

Staff and pupils are very excited to launch our new weekly 'Reading Café' starting in January. We had a trial recently and then asked staff and pupils their thoughts and feelings, and it resulted in everybody loving it.

How does it work? Every Monday each member of teaching staff chooses a book that they would like to read and add this to our 'Reading Menu.' Throughout the week, the menu is passed to each class and the children choose which book they are going to listen to. On Thursday at 3pm, each child goes to the chosen classroom and enjoys listening to an adult read either the whole text or part of the text.

Why are we starting a weekly Reading Café? We want to give children their Pupil voice. This allows them the right to choose which book or adult they would like to work with as well as offering them a chance to enjoy an adult read to them in a calm, exciting environment. We are including a wide variety of genres and age range of books.

How can you help? Each week we would also like to have a mystery reader. The mystery reader will still add their book to the school reading café but pupils will not know who the adult is. During our trial, Mrs Harris (Pre-school Lead) was our mystery reader and the children were very intrigued trying to guess who it was going to be. We would welcome parents and grandparents as mystery readers.

Please find attached a slip below that we would ask you to return if you would like to be one of our mystery readers. Once we have all the completed slips, we will be allocating weeks and will let you know which date you will be reading on. Please keep this a secret from your child, as we want all children intrigued and curious.
