She has published four novels and three collections of poetry, as well as short stories and education resources. Her youngadult novel, *Hidden*, was a *Sunday Times Children's Book* of the Week and nominated for the Carnegie Medal. It has recently been staged in a small Paris theatre.

She will be sharing the book The Emergency Zoo with children and will also have copies available to buy for  $\pounds 6.00$  if pupils are interested.
