How Are We Doing?

Thank you for the suggestions we have received in our "You Say, We Do" box.

"After School Timetable—can times be put on so we know when they finish?" - Times for all after school clubs are published at the beginning of each term and on the Newsletter each week in Diary Dates column.

"Can children attending a club after school have a snack, e.g. a biscuit/fruit?" - As time is very limited for clubs, it is not feasible to offer snacks.

"More music and instrument lessons" - Music provided in our school is above what is required in the curriculum. Children have music lessons every fortnight as well as having access to violin and guitar lessons. Also, Y4 get a ten week course in a musical instrument each year and years 1 & 2 have Ocarina lessons. In addition to this, music plays a big part in our school performances, whole school and class assemblies and we participate in the Oundle Festivals.

"I am always bemused to receive letters asking my child to take part in an inter-school competition. The upcoming cross country competition next week for example, when the school offers no clubs in that sport for he children to practice both the sport and how to play as a team in the run" - We always prepare children for sporting competitions as part of the PE lesson and, where necessary, run additional clubs, e.g. Gymnastics, to prepare them.

"Please could you run a dance club after school (for all of KS2 at least)?" In the Spring Term 2 through to Summer Term 2, we offer an after school dance club for KS2 only and this is because they take part in a Primary Showcase event. We do not have plans to offer a dance club to other year groups.

"It would be lovely if there were more lunchtime clubs for the children: choir, chess, dance, for example" - Unfortunately, we do not have capacity to run lunchtime clubs as teachers have lunchtime duties and need to prepare for the afternoon lessons. However, games are run throughout lunchtime by Lunchtime Supervisors and Sports Crew members.
