## **BACKGROUND SUMMARY**

As part of the Accessibility Plan and Accessibility Audit (Physical Environment) needs to be undertaken to inform the relevant Action Plan.

## **AUDIT BASIS**

The aim is improve access to the physical environment of the school, adding specialist facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of the school and physical aids to access education. The school is required to ensure that disabled pupils, staff and visitors do not receive less favourable treatment and to do this the school has a duty to make reasonable adjustments.

The Audit needs to recognise limitations imposed by the site including the buildings' listed nature. Recommendations are to be categorised under three headings - SHORT TERM (Within 12 Months) - generally items with a low resource requirement and cost and/or relating to a H&S Issue and/or be deemed to be of high importance. MEDIUM TERM (Within 3 Years) – items which are subject to resource/finance availability

LONG TERM (unknown Timescale) – Items that require extensive resources/finances and/or where the practicality of the item is unproven
