The children are asked to complete a 'Learning Journal' as part of their homework. They will be asked to demonstrate their learning from literacy, numeracy, topic and phonics (Early Years & KS1) sessions that week, and they may choose their own way of demonstrating what they have learnt. Please see the front of your child's Learning Journal for further details and ideas.

Reading is expected to take place every day at home. Please make a record of your child's reading in their red reading journal. As well as listening to their word decoding and fluency, please check your child understands what they are reading by asking them questions about the text. Please see below the reading booklet and comprehension question prompt sheet to help parents support their child with reading at home.


Each week your child is given spellings to learn at home. If you wish to extend them further, you could ask them to write a sentence for each word.

Please Note: In Year 6, after the October half term break, the children are provided with English and Mathematics revision SATs books, which they complete for homework instead of Learning Journals.

Homework will be given out on Fridays for completion by the following Thursday. We welcome parents supporting their child with homework, especially with speaking and listening activities set in the Early Years and Key Stage 1.




