For their TASC they have made PowerPoint quizzes, sewn Wonder Woman masks and created wonderful art work inspired by Kandinsky.

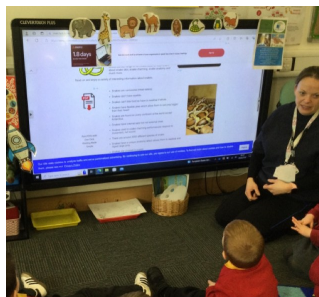
This afternoon; they performed their class assembly to their families showing their learning of Wonder Women. It was amazing! Well done Year 2!

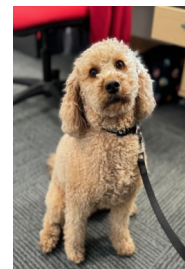
A child can be nominated by a Teacher or peer for a Headteacher/Mabel award. In Celebration Assembly the child can choose either a headteachers award or Mabel time.
