Our curriculum builds on the strong roots of our values to take the children on a journey of knowledge to 'grow a love for learning' and develop skills for life.

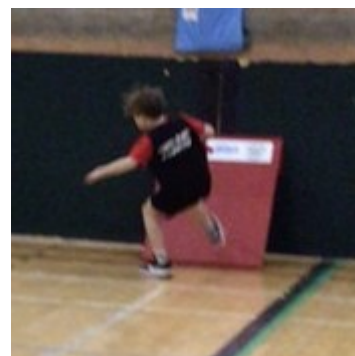
This Week's News cont....

On Thursday, our Y3/4 and Y5/6 Indoor Athletics Team went to the County finals at Kettering Leisure Village and competed against 10 other teams in their age category!

As the smallest school there, by quite a margin, we not only managed to represent and hold our own - We Smashed it! Our athletes competed in a variety of track and fielding events throughout the morning: obstacle relay, 1:1 relay, 2:2 relay, 1:1 hurdle relay, 6 lap parlauf, over/under relay, 4:1 relay, chest push, standing long jump, five strides, standing triple jump, vertical jump, soft javelin, and speed bounce! They all ran, bounced, threw, jumped and supported one another in the most wonderful way, representing our school on the field and track but also from the sidelines with heart and love! We couldn't be more proud!

Both Team's came 6th in the County, this is an amazing achievement for a small village school. 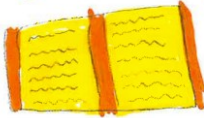

A child can be nominated by a Teacher or peer for a Headteacher/Mabel award. In Celebration Assembly the child can choose either a headteachers award or Mabel time.

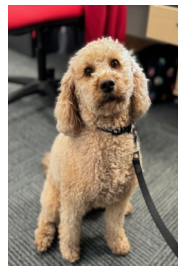
