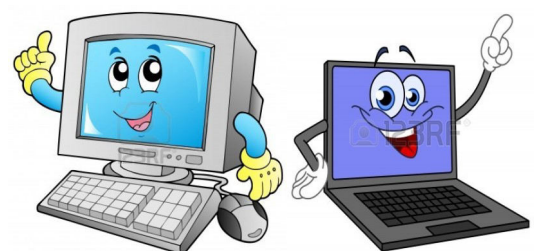

These rules help us to keep safe on the Internet:
'Think then Click'

We only use the internet when a trusted adult is with us.

We only use websites we know are safe and age appropriate.

If we are unsure about a website we ask a grown up to check it first.

When using the internet, if something pops up we are unsure of, we will speak to a trusted adult straight away.

We only open and send e-mails to friends and family and we make sure a responsible adult is with us.

We will keep our phones, tablets and any other electronic devices at home and not bring them into school.

Cyber-Bullying

If we see something we don't like, we know to tell a trusted adult.

We know we are too young for social networks.
We know not to share our personal details.

We know how to stay safe on the internet.
