| Training Drawing and Talking Thompson Teaching Tools Attachment Difficulties | £1124    | Training for our learning mentor in social and emotional strategies has given children the opportunity to be able to talk about issues and think about positive ways in which to deal with them. Thompson Teaching Tools has up-levelled teachers' knowledge and skills in spelling and phonics.   |
| Family Support Worker  | £1104.50 | Early intervention work with families has had a positive impact on children's attendance, their care and therefore their learning. Support for families has given parents and children the opportunity to work through issues in a positive manner and put them in contact with support groups/councillors. This has enabled the child to be able to move forward with their learning development.   |
| Behaviour Consultant   | £1600    | Early referrals are imperative in gaining a quick diagnosis of a child's needs so that the school can support the child to ensure they experience success and continuous progress.   |

Her service may be required for a variety of reasons. | School Activity Days Puzzle Challenge Day Snail Tails Day   | £893       | The Mind Mission day presented children with challenging activities in which they developed their critical thinking, reasoning, problem solving and team building skills. This particularly gave the opportunity for our higher ability children to lead. It allowed children to gain a deeper understanding of concepts and develop their problem solving skills.  Snail Tails Day takes the children through a process where they explore talk in a supportive learning context. It contributes to developing children's language choices and makes them think about how effective a particular word or phrase is. This developmental exploration through talk scaffolds children's progress in writing. |
