Governor Report

The full Governing Body has met five times this academic year. All governors contribute to these meetings through written reports. The governors ensure these reports summarise key points of their monitoring work, along with outlining the key challenge questions that have been asked. This year we have been focussing on development of the below key areas:

 Governors demonstrate ownership for their roles & responsibilities and are proactive in updating their knowledge

All written reports produced demonstrate that governors are taking ownership of their roles. We use the Key and the National Governors Association to prepare for our meetings and ensure that we are asking the right questions.

 Governors consistently hold the Head Teacher and Senior leaders to account in all areas of the School performance



The chair of Governors meets with the Head teacher regularly to keep up to date with the day to day running of the school. Governors meet with Senior Leaders to monitor the impact of the work they have been doing. We meet with the assessment leader every term to review data, the Inclusion governor meets with the SENCO and Senior Leaders attended the full governors meeting to report on their action plans and focus for the year.

• Improve communication between the Governing Body and stakeholders.

Governors held an open morning in December for parents to attend to enable them to meet us and find out more about what we do.

Through our facebook page we have been sharing the role of the governors and who is responsible for each area of the school. We will continue with this over the next academic year.

We have written two newsletters to share with parents the work of the governing body and when governors visit school we are sharing this via our facebook page.

We know this is an area that has been identified through our surveys so we will continue to think of ways that we can improve communication - Our door is always open if you ever need to discuss things with the team.

Safeguarding and Surveys - Jim Gilbey

Last year saw many changes in statutory government requirements which we needed to ensure we incorporated into our, already thorough, safeguarding policies. During the year I carried out numerous monitoring visits to determine whether the safeguarding policies were being followed successfully. This ranged from monitoring key documents, focussing on safeguarding within lessons and talking to the children to evaluate the effectiveness of the E-safety lessons that were undertaken.

My other main role is to conduct and analyse the anonymous parent, staff and student surveys. For each survey, the analysis, together with any comments written, are raised at one of the governor meetings where it is decided how to address the issues that arise (positive as well as negative). These are then incorporated into our future development plans and the findings of surveys are sent out to all stakeholders.

Next year I will be attending ongoing safeguarding training to ensure that I am aware of the latest developments and requirements. I will also be investigating alternative methods of conducting surveys, potentially with online methods (any suggestions are always welcome).

Finance - Nick Buckle.

This year all governors received finance training from Catherine Walker a Local Authority representative. This training enables all governors to ask the right questions in relation to finance for their areas. The



core purpose of the governing body is to oversee the financial performance of the school and make sure its money is well spent. To enable this to happen finance governors have met with the bursar and the head teacher six times over the year. They are responsible for overseeing the budget at key points in the year we report to the Local Authority and we have an external auditor checking our accounts.

SEND and Inclusion, First Aid and medical needs Governor - Caroline Filby

In the first half of the Year I carried out a First aid and medical needs Audit. The challenge questions I had could all be answered and Mrs Cunningham was extremely thorough in explaining each aspect of this area.

In my role as Inclusion governor I have met with the SENCo, Mrs Yeo several times, and together with 2 teaching and learning walks I have been able to gain an understanding of the ethos and aims of the school. I have seen how the school supports all children, especially those that have additional needs. I have been delighted to see the support and care that goes to support all children and look forward in the coming year to working with Mrs Yeo to gain a further insight and understanding of how the school supports these children

PE - Richard Luff

Since moving to the new school premises our provision for sports has improved significantly, which is reflected in the performances the children have made when representing KCEPS in tournaments throughout the county. We have also continued to invest heavily in new equipment and to develop links with Local clubs.

In my role I monitor and seek to ensure, through our sports curriculum, all children develop as individuals, gain a rounded view of sports, as well as develop knowledge in areas such as healthy living - all in a safe, inclusive and enjoyable environment.

Through surveys taken throughout the year we know what sports the children would like us to focus on and have developed our timetables to support these ambitions. I look forward to another highly successful academic year!

Teaching and Learning - Suzie Julien

This year our four teaching and learning governors Jim, Louise, Caroline and myself have focussed on this key area from our school development plan:

Plan a curriculum that gives children greater freedom to ask questions and lead their learning

Every visit to school involves governors talking to children, identifying key things in the environment that will support learning and sharing the work the children complete in their books. Governors have found these visits extremely valuable in supporting the messages that are shared in our full governor meetings. The children we talk to are selected at random and never fail to articulate what they are doing and why they are doing it. Over the year we have seen greater independence in learning and their meta cognitive skills have developed. This means they understand how they learn and they are able to



transfer these skills across all areas of the curriculum. We have seen much more cross curricular learning over the year for example during a maths lesson children were engaged in PE and using the data collected for their maths and in an English lesson the children were making music to support their writing.

Teaching and Learning governors also meet with the assessment lead, Miss Knight 3 times a year. This provides governor's opportunity to discuss whole school data and ask questions. Miss Knight produces a detailed report for governors and challenge questions are sent in advance. All this information is then shared at our full governor meetings.

Over the next year teaching and learning governors will continue to focus on how the children are leading their learning and also how the outdoor environment is being used to provide a broad and balanced curriculum.
