


TABLE 1: ABOUT YOUR CHILDREN



TABLE 2: ETHOS & ATTITUDES




TABLE 3: COMMUNICATIONS






TABLE 4: SCHOOL LEADERSHIP




TABLE 5: SCHOOL PROVISION






TABLE 6: KCES IN THE COMMUNITY




TABLE 7: ADDITIONAL COMMENTS AND REPSONSES

COMMENTS ON WHAT WE ARE DOING WELL...

Teaching & Learning

"Lots of fun and creative ways of learning. It is such a pleasure to have a child who always wants to come to school and talk so fondly of all the adults in her classroom." "Great and varied curriculum that encourages a real love of learning."

"The staff are fantastic - a really strong team. I have been very happy with both class teachers this year."

"The main thing is that my children are very happy at school and seem to be doing very well. Even if I don't agree with everything the main thing is their happiness, so well done to all."

"We have been delighted with the two class teachers this year. They have brought so much energy, enthusiasm and passion to the school and are outstanding teachers." "Excellent support from staff in foundation stage. Quick to respond to any issues."

Communication

"Communication through parent view is timely and helpful."




ISSUES / CONCERNS RAISED	Comments
Teaching & Learning	
The amount of homework set each week has a detrimental impact on family life.(1 response)	Homework follows the guidance from the DfE and the recommended timings are outlined in our homework policy which is available on our website. Governors recommend that If you are finding that homework is taking longer than stated in our policy please speak to the class teacher in the first instance.
Focus on discipline sometimes overshadows enjoyment of learning.(1 response)	As recognised by Ofsted (March 2015) we were judged as outstanding for behaviour and safety. The school policy and procedures are reviewed annually. We would always encourage parents to talk to their child's class teacher if they have any concerns.
Greater focus on middle range ability children to ensure they achieve their full potential. (1 response)	The governing body along with the Senior Leadership Team monitor children's progress throughout the year to ensure the needs of every child are being met.
Communication	
"More regular feedback on child's progress other than just parents evenings. Would like to be able to support learning at home so some ideas to do this would be helpful." (1 response) "More detailed information on current and projected attainment levels should be made available at parents' evenings." (1 response)	Your child's class teacher is always available to meet with you to give updates on your child's progress. Previously, parent workshops have been poorly attended. When asked their preference parents overwhelmingly responded that they would like to receive support and information through our newsletters and the website. We would direct you to www.kingscliffeschool.co.uk – Information – curriculum – parents' workshops. Here you will find videos on supporting your child in different areas of the curriculum including homework. If there is anything specific you would like support with please speak with your child's class teacher in the first instance.
"Teacher parent relationships: little opportunity to develop these." (1 response)	The governing body and staff recognise continuous communication with parents is vital to build a cohesive relationship. Teachers are always happy to meet to talk about the progress of your child or any issues you have. The school also holds TASC open afternoons termly and regular events that parents are invited to e.g. Sports Day, May Fayre, Class Assemblies etc. These are ideal times for building teacher/parent relationships.
"The communications from school seem a bit late sometimes." "Slightly more notice on school events, trips etc. (to allow more time for getting dressing up clothes etc.)." "More notice required for when parents are required to help. As a full-time working mum to help out I need lots of notice!" (1 response)	Thank you for your comment. We try to publicise events ahead of time through our weekly newsletter and will continue to strive in giving as much notice as possible.
Ethos & Leadership	
Recruit good teachers. (1 response)	The Governors and Senior Leadership Team have recognised through their monitoring procedures that all teachers are good or outstanding and this was recognised by a visit from the Local Education Authority in June 2016.
I am not sure that the school values individuality and feel this can stifle a child's development. (1 response)	The fortnightly values that are published in the Newsletter promote individuality and the School Rights promote respect for everyone.
Provision	
I am very disappointed about year five not having a residential. I feel they should have had one this year. (1 response)	This decision was based on parents' views early in the summer term; an overwhelming response was parents wanted a Year 3 and 4, and a Year 5 and 6 residential. This means our current Year 5s will end their time at KCES with a residential when they are in Year 6.

Look for ways to extend learning and use teachers' skills for after-school activities. (1 response)	Thank you for your comment. The Governors are aware we currently use the strengths of the teachers and support staff for homework, archery, dance, a range of sporting activities, gardening, first aid, music and crafts. This varies each year and is monitored.
Flexible after school care. (1 response)	Governors work closely with KIA and are confident that the new arrangement allows for flexibility in before and after school care.
I didn't like that the mad science company did a bit of a hard sell to the children. A letter to parents would suffice. (1 response)	Thank you - we will ensure that this is monitored closely if Mad Science are used next year.
I have paid £35 for enrichment activities but to date my child has been on one trip at a cost of £7.50. I am aware of the parents did not pay the £35 and feel I am subsidising other children's enrichment activities. (1 response)	The breakdown of how this money is spent is shared annually with parents and governors monitor it closely.
KCES in the community	
"It would be nice to have more opportunities to attend celebration assemblies once the school has a larger hall in the new premises." (1 response) "If the size of hall allows, have a weekly assembly open to all parents." (1 response)	Thank you - we are also looking forward to this.
"I consider parents are a resource and I am not sure they are used as well as they might be in terms of areas for improvement and focus." (1 response)	Please contact the school office to offer your services as parent volunteers are warmly welcomed.
"More interactive school home platforms (online) would be good. E.g. Mathletics or equivalent. More digital curriculum learning e.g. touch typing, Excel, PowerPoint, coding, et cetera. Doing and submitting homework via a platform. More visibility of progress through portal." (1 response)	Thank you for your comment regarding learning platforms. We have had a learning platform in the past but with the weak broadband at present it was not successful. This could be something we look into in our new school when we will have a much faster broadband. As part of the school's progressive curriculum children are taught how to use a QUERTY keyboard and all the programmes you mentioned. Over the last 12 months the school has invested heavily in IT, including Learn Pads.
