


Reception Curriculum Overview Spring 2

Spring



Intent We would like the children to develop a love of reading and books as part of book fortnight and be able to articulate their knowledge of the book I Don't Like Books. We want the children to learn about the world around them during Spring time and be able to identify signs of Spring and talk about the life cycle of a chick. The children will be able to talk about why Christians celebrate Easter and what traditions are.

Implementation Reception will read the story 'I Don't Like Books' and will explore the detective element of the story. The children will become detectives themselves, by identifying the clues and creating missing posters. We will be spending time outside identifying signs of Spring, making observations of the daffodil bulbs they planted at the beginning of the year as well as observing real chicks hatch from an egg. The children will take part in Easter celebrations with their peers to help them understand how Christians celebrate Easter.

Impact The children will see the value in reading books and will be enthusiastic readers. They will find the joy that can come from reading and exploring books. They will have a clear understanding of what Spring is and they will be able to independently identify signs of Spring at school and at home. Our children will have good scientific enquiry skills because they will have practiced their ability to predict and make observations. The children will be tolerant individuals who celebrate religious events. Taking part in Easter celebrations will develop their cultural capital too.

Celebration Children's POW projects will be celebrated termly in the whole school POW gallery. Celebration assembly will take place every Friday to congratulate the children on their achievements inside and outside of school. Tapestry will be used to communicate any celebratory moments with parents and careers.
